

Horace City Council Meeting Minutes

Due to COVID-19 and social distancing, the Horace City Council meeting took place online on April 20, 2020 @ 6:05 pm. Those present on the Zoom video conference call were Mayor Kory Peterson, Councilmember Chelsey Johnson, Councilmember Bryan Schmidt, Councilmember John Koerselman, Councilmember Dave Fenelon. Mayor Peterson called the meeting to order.

Mayor Peterson forwent the pledge of allegiance.

Agenda Item #6: Public Comment

A question was asked if the special assessments are being financed by the City? Mr. Holper explained that the City takes a temporary bond out to complete the project. Once the project is complete, it goes through permanent financing. Individuals in the assessment district will be responsible for the cost permanently financed.



Erica and Josh Machow asked what they should do next after their house was incorrectly assessed? Mr. Holper said that all assessment questions will be addressed during the Tax Equalization Meeting during agenda item #8.

Agenda Item #7: Sheriff's Update

There was no update from the Sheriff's department.

Agenda Item #8: Tax Equalization Meeting | Paul Fracassi, Cass County Director of Tax Equalization Mr. Fracassi summarized the Reappraisal Project and stated that a total of \$367,370,000 of residential property and a total of \$6,458,700 of agricultural property was evaluated. Commercial land was not reviewed but had been evaluated from previous years at a total of \$10,945,600. A total of \$13,604,400 of commercial improvement had also been assessed.

Mr. Ehler, president of Vanguard Appraisals Inc., explained how they evaluated each property. The City of Horace never had official property evaluations done before. The new assessments will help the Cass County Tax Equalization office monitor future sales and adjust property values accordingly.

The new property evaluation list will be posted on the County's webpage on April 21st, 2020. Mr. Holper explained that property owners who still want to appeal their assessment can send an email to request@cityofhorace.com. The deadline for appeals to the City is on April 21st, 2020 at 12:00 pm. Anyone who wants appeal to the County will have until June 2020.

Mr. Dahlman gave an update on both easements. The permanent easement is in the total amount of \$28,749.60. The temporary easement is in the total amount of \$2,299.22 which brings the combined total to \$31,048.82.

April 20th, 2020 the Sanitary Sewer Improvement District No. 2018-01 (Service to 100th Ave.) plans and specification will be approved. April 27th, 2020 the advertisement will run in the paper. Open bids are scheduled for May 14th, 2020. On May 18th, 2020, the project will be awarded. The project is estimated to be completed on November 2nd, 2020. The total cost is estimated at \$829,000.00.

Agenda Item #12: Sanitary Sewer Lift Station No. 4 (Chestnut – Ironwood) Updates | Jim Dahlman, City Engineer and Brenton Holper, City Administrator

Mr. Dahlman presented an operational review that was conducted by the City of the Sanitary Sewer Lift Station No. 4 (Chestnut – Ironwood). The lift station was constructed in 1998 for a 66-home subdivision of Chestnut and Ironwood. The pumps were updated in 2005. The review conducted from August 15th, 2019 to March 31st, 2020 indicates that Lift Station No. 4 is experiencing greater flows than the system was designed for. These flows have caused the lift station and 3-inch force main to fall behind the inflow rate resulting in extended periods of pumping. Ruds Addition added 18 additional units to the system for a total of 84 units.

Mr. Dahlman concluded that the review will be used in the future when the system will be rehabilitated. A simple upsizing of the pumps and force main will not be sufficient.

Agenda Item #13: Title V City Ordinance Text Amendment | Barrett Voigt, Community Development Director

Mr. Voigt presented the Title V City Ordinance Text Amendment request. One of the codes used in the current Title V City Ordinance that regulates the City's building code is obsolete. The Title V City Ordinance Text Amendment request is to update the language to reference the North Dakota State Building Code.

Motion: Approve the proposed Title V City Ordinance Text Amendment.

Agenda Item #14: Introduction to Shoppes @ Brookstone Concept | Brenton Holper, City Administrator Barrett Voigt, Community Development Director

Mr. Holper introduced the Shoppes @ Brookstone concept which would take up two parcels in the Visto Industrial Addition. The proposed buildings would be rental properties for industrial businesses. Mr. Voigt added that it would be the Council's decision if the property would be subdivided or if Council would prefer single lots for each individual building.

Councilmember Koerselman asked how different businesses would intermix and would still abide to the Zoning Code? Mr. Smith, who was on the phone, responded that it would depend on the City's exclusion of certain businesses. The environment of each building is controllable and customizable, it therefore should not pose a problem in general. The rental properties would promote a lot of new businesses to the area and an additional income stream for the City.

Agenda Item #15: Engineering / Public Works | Jim Dahlman, City Engineer

Construction at Cub Creek and Visto's 3rd Addition is starting up. On Wednesday, April 29th, 2020, the Sanitary Sewer Line to Fargo will start operating and sending wastewater to Fargo. Construction at Maple Lane will start in the first week of May 2020. Contractors for the Middle and High School are looking into increasing staff.

Agenda Item #16: Midwest Inspection Services | Brenton Holper, City Administrator

Mr. Holper presented the Midwest Inspection Services proposal and estimate. Midwest Inspection Services would finish the inspections for the Middle and High School. The proposal includes the inspection and plan review for both athletic complexes.

The Middle School's inspections (building, mechanical, and project correspondence) are not to exceed \$19,750.00. The plan review of the West Fargo Public School Horace Athletic Complex is not to exceed \$3,500.00. The West Fargo Public School Horace Athletic Complex inspections (building, mechanical, and project correspondence) are not to exceed \$14,000.00. The total amount (\$37,250.00) of the Midwest Inspection Services proposal is approximately half of what the City of West Fargo More Engineering inspections would have charged.

Motion: Approve the proposal for the remaining inspections for the Middle school, inspections for the school athletic complex and plan review for the school athletic complex from Midwest Inspection. Services.
